### FESTIVAL FUN - JUNE 2nd AND 3rd NEXT

The highlight of this year's festival will again be the Parade but this year, it will be led by 'Diarmaid MacMurrough' on his way to his inauguration ceremony as the King of Leinster on the grounds of Ferns Castle.

A festival celebrating community, heritage and culture will be held over two days, June 2nd & 3rd. All events are free to enter and all are welcome – so please help spread the word. The festival is a community event and we'd love you to be part of it.

### Concert on the grounds of Ferns Castle - Sunday, June 2nd at 7pm

The main event on Day I of the festival, will be a Celtic Jazz concert entitled 'Marriage of Two Cultures' to be held on an outdoor stage on the grounds of Ferns Castle. The concert will premiere a specially commissioned piece inspired by the Gaelic/Norman relationship established in I2th century by Diarmait MacMurrough, King of Leinster through to contemporary times.

The location and performances by award winning vocalist/composer Melanie O'Reilly & her Celtic Jazz Ensemble along with the renowned choreographer Karine Saporta, and her dancers from Normandy ensures this will be a memorable experience.




## Colourful Festival Parade on Monday, June 3rd at 12 noon

The highlight of the festival will be the community parade on Day 2 – giant props, medieval costumes and a Brazilian style carnival band will ensure a memorable visual spectacle.

The parade will be a mix of medieval costume, local groups and re-enactors. The infamous Diarmait MacMurrough, the 12th century Gaelic King who ruled from Ferns will even make an appearance alongside Strongbow & Aoife.

The Parade will start at 12noon from St. Edan's Cathedral and will make its way to Ferns Castle.

Following the parade, on the grounds of Ferns Castle, festival goers are in for a treat as they will witness Diarmait MacMurrough addressing his people.



### **Fringe Events**

Fringe events on Sunday feature a busking competition with a €200 prize to the winner, family activities at Ferns Community Park including Bemusement Games with Fuinseog Woodland, the Setanta Challenge and medieval stocks.

Also, don't miss the Norman & Gaelic Names project - a Coats of Arms exhibition by pupils of both local school at Scoil Naomh Maodhóg.

On Monday at Ferns Castle, enjoy medieval re-enactments, face painting, music and The Snails Tale.



#### **Guided Tours and Talks**

A first for Ferns - guided walking tours to key medieval sites in 4 languages – Japanese, French, Irish and English. Over the 2 days, other tours include a Rebel Tour of Ferns focusing on the 1798 Rebellion, the 1916 Rising and the Irish War of Independence and Civil War; a guided tour of the Ferns Tapestries in the Visitors Centre and a Talk and Display on Bees at the skeps in the Cathedral graveyard. The tours offer great variety to those interested in connecting with our heritage.



#### Music in local pubs - Trad, Folk, Dixieland, Blues and more

There will be a feast of music in all Ferns pubs on Sunday, June 2nd including Dunbars, Peter Doyle's, The Thatch and The Courtyard. Music will commence at 3.30pm immediately after the Ferns Patron until late in the evening. Artists booked to appear include Kieran McEvoy, Karen Dunbar, Pat Fitzpatrick, Eddie Crean & Richard King, Brian Wall & Sean Mythen, Helena Dunbar and her trad group, trad box players PJ Arthur & Lar White and many more.
